#### 2.0 SCIENTIFIC SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

(by Y.M. Raja Dr Elina Aziddin, Chairman of Scientific Subcommittee)

#### 2.1 Activities carried out in the second half of 2021

# 2.1.1 Participation in the IFCC Townhall for APFCB Region

The MACB Council participated in the IFCC Townhall that was organized for the APFCB region on 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2021. The event provided an opportunity for members to interact and ask questions with the IFCC president and Executive board.

MACB requested IFCC to continue hosting hybrid meetings and conferences as the Covid-19 travel restrictions are still imposed by the Malaysian government. Hybrid meetings and conferences are also more affordable and therefore will encourage a bigger participation from Malaysian delegates.

#### 2.1.2 MACB 31<sup>st</sup> Annual General Meeting: Pre- AGM Scientific Program

The 31st Malaysian Association of Clinical Biochemists (MACB) Annual General Meeting (AGM) for 2021 was successfully carried out virtually on Tuesday. 26<sup>th</sup>. Oct, 2021.

Prior to the 31<sup>st</sup> MACB AGM, a 2-hr scientific program was organised for members. In the first hour, a webinar on the topic of Method Verification for Qualitative Tests for delivered by Associate Professor Dr Pavai Sthaneswar from University Malaya Medical Centre.

This was followed by a forum on the topic 'A practical approach to lot-to-lot verification'. The 3 panellists for the forum were Dr Tony Badrick, CEO of RCPAQAP, Dr Nor'ashikin bt Othman from Hospital Kuala Lumpur and Rozita Abdullah from Hospital Sg Buloh. The forum was moderated by Dr Raja Elina, President of MACB.

The scientific program received good response and had active participation from members.

#### 2.1.3 Project on Method Evaluation for TSH, PCT and HFABP diagnostic kits

The MACB coordinated a research project in 2020 that was completed in 2021. The project was a collaboration between Hospital Canselor Tunku Muhriz UKM (HCTM UKM), Malaysian Association Clinical Biochemist (MACB) and Shenzhen New Industries Biomedical Engineering Co., Ltd. (SNIBE). The project involved method evaluation for Maglumi Thyroid Stimulating Hormone (TSH), Procalcitonin (PCT) and Heart Fatty Acid Binding Protein (HFABP) diagnostic kits on Maglumi 1000 analyzer. The objectives of the study were as follows:

- To verify the performance of Maglumi 1000 analyzer for precision, accuracy, linearity range and Limit of Quantitation (Functional Sensitivity) as compared to manufacturer's claim and analytical quality requirement.
- To evaluate the correlation between Maglumi 1000 VS Architect i2000sr for TSH assay, Maglumi 1000 VS Cobas e411 for PCT assay and Maglumi 1000 VS HUMASIS Hubi-QuanPRO for HFABP assay.
- To provide objective evidence that the new analyzer fulfills the requirements for a specific intended use.

Results of the TSH study was presented in a poster presentation at the 31<sup>st</sup> MACB Conference on 21-22<sup>nd</sup> June 2021. A complete report on the study was completed on 12<sup>th</sup> July 2021 and will be published in a scientific journal in the near future.

#### 2.1.4 Project on Measurably Better Healthcare Performance

The MACB launched the project to encourage inter-disciplinary collaboration and to promote a value-based approach in the delivery of laboratory medicine services. The first meeting on the project was held virtually on 9<sup>th</sup> December 2021. Representatives from leading government and private hospitals and laboratories attended the meeting.

The MACB president gave a briefing on the project and Mr Lim Yew Khuay from Abbott presented some examples of projects from winners of the Univants Award program. This project is supported by Abbott Laboratories and is due to start in early 2022.

#### 2.2 Activities in 2022

#### 2.2.1 Project on Measurably Better Healthcare Performance

Five (5) project submissions were received from 2 institutions, 2 from Hospital Selayang and 3 from Pantai Premier Pathology. Due to limited funds, one project from each institution was selected in March 2022. The study is currently ongoing.


# 2.2.2 Workshop

The Scientific Committee has to date conducted 3 physical workshops in 2022. All 3 workshops were carried out in collaboration with Department of Standards Malaysia.


#### 2.2.2.1 Method Verification for Qualitative Tests - Two Workshops

The first workshop on Method Verification for Qualitative Tests was held on 21st March 2022. This workshop was organised as a followup to the lecture that was held at the 31st MACB AGM on a similar topic.

Due to the situation of the Covid-19 pandemic, the number of participants had to be limited and only 56 participants were allowed to participate. This one-day hands-on workshop was very well received and 95 % found the workshop relevant and useful. Topics covered include precision, verification of cut-off value and comparison studies for qualitative tests. Participants feedback is presented below




Due to requests from participants who were unsuccessful in their registration to the first workshop, a second workshop on Method Verification for Qualitative Tests was caried out on 2 August, 2022. This workshop had 87 participants and more than 97% found the workshop relevant and useful for their job.



## 2.2.2.2 Approach to Method Verification for Quantitative Tests to Fulfil ISO 15189 Requirements

This 2-day workshop was held on 18-19th July 2022 and had 83 participants. Topics include quality specifications, imprecision, method comparison, linearity, reportable range, detection limit, functional sensitivity, verification of reference interval and how to prepare a method verification report.

Participants found this hands-on workshop very relevant and useful and due to the high demand a second workshop on the same topic will be carried out in October 2022. Participants feedback is presented below:



#### 2.2.3 Collaboration with other professional societies



The Malaysian Association of Clinical Biochemist (MACB) organised a discussion on the topic of Non-alcoholic Fatty Liver Disease (NAFLD) with Prof Dr. Rosmawati Mohamed, Consultant Hepatologist, University of Malaya and medical lab representatives from various hospitals on Tuesday, 14 June, 2022 @12 noon. Agenda of the discussion were as follows:

- 1. Background on NAFLD disease burden and impact
- 2. Background and rationale of liver disease screening and risk stratification at the primary care level
- 3. Potential for reflex fibrosis-4 (FIB-4) scoring algorithm and consensus workflow for liver disease screening and risk stratification.

The objective of the discussion was to create better awareness among medical lab professional on NAFLD and to formulate an algorithm on lab testing for better detection and management of NAFLD in hospitals and public health labs in the country.

#### 2.2.4 MACB Annual Conference

The 32<sup>nd</sup> MACB Conference will be held from 11-13 September, 2022. A pre-conference which will focus on Point of Care Testing (POCT) will be held on 11 September 2022 followed by a 2-day conference. The theme of the virtual conference is "Integrated Approach in Medical Laboratory: Challenges and Opportunities". Various topics of interest such as integrated diagnostics, updates on eGFR reporting, personalised medicine and quality management.

#### 3.0 EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

(by Y.M. Tunku Marinah, Chairman of Education Subcommittee)

#### 3.1 Skills Training for Clinical Biochemists

The Chairman of the Working Committee for NOSS, En. Rusli Ibrahim resigned due to work commitments. A virtual meeting and a face-to-face meeting attended by many of the committee representatives were held in 2022 to discuss the way forward. It was agreed that a Working Committee was not needed for the time being. A Curriculum meeting/workshop will be held to work on details such as the allocated hours for each topic/lecture and trainers required.

Previously MACB had registered with SLDN as a training centre but this was not finalised due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Last year the Ministry of Human Resources introduced a new software called Myspike for all applications and we were told that we have to register all over again. Similarly for registration of Hospital Kuala Lumpur and Pantai Premier Pathology as "Syarikat" for the practical training. This will cause a delay in the whole process but is now being addressed.

It was decided that Tunku Marinah will register as the Pengurus for MACB to manage the registrations and input into the new software, while Puan Norlida Harun will be appointed as Penyelaras for MACB.

Previous arrangement for the syllabus, exams and appointment of trainers and coaches will be reviewed. Dr. Shafini will remain as the Pengurus for HKL and Puan Kamisah Karim will replace Puan Siti Gayah as Penyelaras for HKL. For Pantai Premier Pathology, the Pengurus is Low Yoke Lee and Penyelaras is Rusfiza Mustapa.

#### 3.2 Workshop and Webinars

Under the Education Subcommittee, no webinars or workshops were conducted.
